Arts Morning

We had a lovely arts morning last week where the children were learning how to draw ourselves in proportion. We noticed that a lot of the time we are forgetting to draw all of our body parts including necks, hands and feet. It was great to see everyone using their observation skills to draw a mannequin and applying this to draw themselves. We have sent home our very own home sketch books. These are to stay at home for the children to draw in, using pencils, as and when they like. Once a term we will ask for these sketch books to come into school so the children can share and celebrate their artwork.

Year R/1

We have spent two weeks on our story of Where the Wild Things Are and the children have been sequencing the story, describe the setting of the woodlands and the main character Max. We have been sketching a woodland tree and using collages to create the different textures and using oil pastels to draw and colour our own wild thing. Well done to everyone's costumes they have helped us so much to imagine, act and become a real wild thing.

Year 2

In Year 2 we have been busy writing profiles for Mrs Dunne to tell her all about us. We have been learning all about noun phrases and have been using these and different sentence starters in our writing. During book week our classroom has transformed into a forest, just like Max's bedroom and we have written a letter to Max to help him make better choices (using each of the four sentence types). We have enjoyed reading and listening to a range of books this week and a big 'congratulations' to all the children who completed their readathon. In Mathematics we have been learning to tell the time to the nearest five minutes on analogue and digital clocks, any extra practise of this at home would be greatly appreciated. Thank you all for making me so welcome, I am really looking forward to the rest of the year.

Year 3 / 4

It has been a very busy start to the half term and we have had fun starting our new topic and Book Week. As part of our topic we have looked at how oil spillages can lead to the death of the wildlife and started to look at other environmental issues such as the use of plastic. During book week, we created some 'Wild Thing' characters using images of animal body parts off the internet and then using our Art Day skills from last week, we sketched them and used watercolours and pencils to add detail. In English, we looked at what Max was like and his emotions and we compared a film version to the book. For once the film had more detail than the book!
