#### Year R 1

We have also been following instructions, making gingerbread men and writing our own instructions. In Maths we have been focusing on addition and subtraction and chosen the most appropriate method to solve calculations quickly and accurately. ## Year 3 / 4

As part of our water topic we have looked at the different states that things can be and through carrying out an investigation with water, chocolate and jelly, we found out that it is temperature which causes a change in state. We then looked at the changes of state in the Water cycle and the main changes of evaporation, condensation and precipitation. In English, we have been writing a story to show the dangers of plastic in the ocean and how this affects the marine animals and in Geography we researched facts about plastic and the damage that they can have.
