In Maths we have thought about the different times of the day and sorted activities into morning and afternoon and then throughout the day (using lots of different time language), we have ordered the days of the week, months of the year and learned to tell the o'clock time (and half past for YR 1). In English we have been exploring different time connectives and used them to complete sentences. order instructions and then plan and write our own instructions.

4/19 children in R/1 have starting reading at least 1 book. That's 21% engagement.


Henry C has achieved the most correct questions at 92%!

**Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984** 

(A422 Worcester Road, Upton Snodsbury)(Temporary Closure) Order 2021

**Proposed Order:** to close that part of A422 Worcester Road from its junction with C2115 Peopleton Lane to its junction with B4082 Pershore Road

Reason: Footway reconstruction, drainage works and carriageway resurfacing.

**Exemptions:** to permit access to any land or premises fronting the highway affected where there is no other form of access; and to allow the works to be undertaken.
